#### Middle Level Board Meetings

The Middle Level Board of Control met both in-person and virtually this year for general discussion of topics of interest and concern to members, including school climate and culture, rethinking school schedules, managing bullying investigations, networking opportunities for middle level principals and assistant principals, navigating social media with students, recruiting and retaining teachers within shortage areas. The Board was instrumental with providing ideas, input and feedback to the Center for Leadership and Innovation.

#### NAESP and NASSP National Leadership Conference and Virtual Capitol Hill Day

This year, the NAESP and NASSP National Leadership Conference took place in person in Washington, DC, and an advocacy team of principals from Connecticut attended the meetings with Congressional leaders and their staffers.
