DR. MATTHEW KING

Dr. Matthew King is Superintendent of Schools in Wellesley, Massachusetts. Previously he served as superintendent/principal of Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School and the Carlisle K-8 Schools. Matt has taught at the Harvard Graduate School of Education and Wheelock College and has lectured and conducted workshops throughout Massachusetts and across the country on strengthening school culture. He has authored several articles on school culture which have been published in "Educational Leadership" and "Phi Delta Kappan."

DR. KATHLEEN BUTLER

Dr. Butler is assistant professor for middle and secondary education at St. Joseph's College. She is the president of "The Learner's Dimension," a staff development firm that has provided training and publications to educators throughout the world since 1982. She has presented extensively and her curriculum model "Frameworks for Teaching, Learning and Assessment" is widely used by teachers as a comprehensive learner centered planning design.
