Leaders inspiring meaningful change one person, one school, one community at a time. National Honor Society is by design a gathering of talented, high achieving students taking on leadership roles within their schools and communities. The opening session will feature prominent student leaders from high school and college who have impacted individuals and communities in extraordinary ways. As they share their stories, lessons learned, and future plans they will inspire and challenge the audience to dig deep and make meaningful change.

Intentional Leadership

Designing authentic leadership roles. Authentic leadership happens when individuals take action in ways that reflect and embody their core beliefs and passions. Leaders must push beyond self-awareness. They must dig deeper to define what they stand for and what their purpose is. Purpose provides the ‘why’ for a leader’s actions in addition to the ‘what’ and ‘how’ of their leadership style. This workshop will help students to define their core leadership values and to create a plan for authentic leadership roles.

Advisor Workshop

The advisor workshop will be divided into 2 sessions covering distinct and critical areas for National Honor Societies. The first session will focus on selection and the second session will focus on discipline and dismissal. Both sessions will be presented by Elancia Felder, Manager, Honor Societies for NASSP (National Association of Secondary School Principals) NHS, NJHS, NEHS.

“If It’s Mean Intervene”

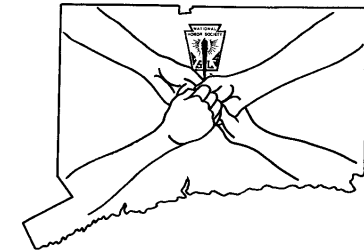
