While the importance of play-based learning in early childhood education is widely recognized, a framework for its successful application in the elementary classroom is still evolving. - play as a spectrum, from free play to teacher-directed play, and where play-based learning falls on that spectrum;
- fundamentals of how play grows brains;
- the six things that should be present for students to learn best; and
- play-based learning implementation approaches.
