Later served as Director of CIAC Unified Sports, expanding the program from a few hundred participants to more than 1,500 upon her retirement.

32-year physical education teacher, 28 years at Norwich Free Academy, started and coached gymnastics, girls' track, and girls' cross country at NFA in the early 70's.

Curtis organized and conducted a statewide public relations program through the media in order to advocate for the growth of girls' sports.

JENNIFER MARSHALL NEALY

Hartford Public Schools track standout, multiple high school state champion in the mid 70s. First female member of the Owls indoor boys track team and first female to compete in, and win an event in the Hartford Invitational Track Meet.

Was the driving force that created HPHS girls' indoor track team; and adding girls' events in the Hartford Invitational Track Meet.
