Dear High School Principal:

On behalf of the Connecticut Association of Schools and our sponsor, Horace Mann, I am writing to tell you about the Twenty-third Annual Governor's Scholars Award Program, a program designed to honor the academic achievements of a select group of Connecticut high school junior year students.

A committee of educators from throughout Connecticut will select finalists from nominations submitted by the CAS member high schools. Nominees are assigned a composite score based on PSAT scores and a timed (one-hour) student essay. All nominees must be representative of the top 5% of their class.

Finalists will be invited to attend the Governor's Scholars awards presentation in May. Finalists will receive a plaque and the opportunity to enrich their studies on a college campus before graduation from high school. Semi-finalists will receive certificates and schools are encouraged to recognize them locally in their school communities.

The nomination will be completed **online** by the principal with the assistance of the nominee's school counselor. **(CAS member login information remains the same from year to year. If you do not know your school's member login information, CAS will release it for the initial nomination to the principal <u>only</u>.) Please ensure that your nominee meets all eligibility requirements before beginning the application process, and ensure that an online application has been submitted by **Monday, February 4, 2019.** Your confirmation email will provide the next steps for the **March 4**<sup>th</sup> online essay. The snow date is March 5<sup>th</sup>.

Before submitting an online nomination form, please ensure that your nominee will be available **in school** on **Monday**, **March 4**, **2019** to participate in the online essay process.

## GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Now in its twenty-third year, the purpose of the Governor's Scholars Program is to recognize academically talented high school junior year students in schools throughout the state and present a select group of top scholars for special recognition to the Governor of Connecticut.

All principals of CAS member high schools are given the opportunity to nominate one junior ranked in the top five percent of his/her class. An essay on an assigned topic is to be completed.

Members of the Governor's Scholars Committee, who are professional educators from throughout Connecticut, judge the completed applications and assign a composite score to each based on PSAT scores and the student essay. These students will represent the top 5% of their class.

In order to recognize this award, a number of colleges and universities throughout Connecticut have collaborated to provide the Governor's Scholars opportunities to further challenge their intellectual curiosity and special talents. These institutions invite the scholars to participate in gratis educational enrichment experiences on campus before graduating high school.

The finalists are celebrated at a luncheon in May and will each be presented with a plaque.

Semi-Finalists receive certificates and are recognized locally in their school communities.

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
