At end of ramp, turn right onto Route 10 South. After approximately 1 1/2 miles, turn left onto Realty Drive (opposite T-Bowl Lanes).

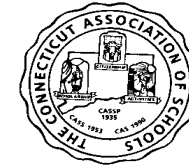
From I-91 South or North
