

How Does It Work?

Step One: Students Sign Up

Students should sign up for the campaign that matches the NASSP student leadership program they are a member of to get started. Students can choose NASSP if they aren't a member of NHS, NJHS, or NatStuCo. Get started by going to the website. (The different student program links are listed on the site.)



Advisers: You do not need to sign up for your students to participate! In fact, because this is a student-run competition, you actually aren't able to. If you want to track your students' overall participation, you are able to do so by monitoring your chapter or council's main campaign page, or each student's individual registration page.

Step Two: Pick a Category

Students should decide in which categories they, their classmates, and their school want to compete. Participants can win everything from **scholarships** for themselves to **school grants** and **trophies**. Click into each category to get more details on how to participate.



Step Three: Get People Registered

Students should work with their peers to register their friends, family, and community to vote! Students can monitor how many people they have individually registered. Need help? We'll be here to answer any questions. Keep an eye on the leaderboard!
