Building a Positive School Climate

What are the benefits of a positve school climate?

- Interactions amongst staff and students are a source of strength and joy
- A positive climate is conducive to strong academic achievement
- Students will learn and practice the skills they will need later in life.
- All members of the community will feel welcomed and valued

What is the impact of the new state law?

- The law shifts the focus from consequences to pro-actively building a positive school climate.
- The school will develop a plan and establish a committee including parents to monitor the implementation of the plan.
- The definition of bullying has changed to inlcude cyber bullying.

What is the definition of Bullying?

- Bullying means the <u>repeated</u> use by one or more students of a written, verbal, or electronic communication, such as cyber bullying, or a physical act or gesture directed at another student attending school in the same school district that:
 - Causes physical or emotional harm to such student or damage to such student's property;
 - Places such student in reasonable fear of harm to himself or herself or of damage to his property;
 - Creates a hostile environment (a situation in which bullying among students is sufficiently severe or pervasive to alter the condition of the school climate) at school for such student
 - Infringes on the rights of such student at school
 - Substantially disrupts the education process or the orderly operation of a school.

How can parents get involved in efforts to improve the school climate?

- Have frequent and honest conversations with your children about school climate, harassment and bullying.
- Lead by example in your acceptance of all races, religions, genders, sexual orientations, socio-economic status, etc
- Serve on the SSCC Safe School Climate Committee
- Encourage your children to participate in Safe School Climate Awareness Day
- Volunteer to help supervise and chaperone school activities
- Report incidents of harassment and bullying to school personnel in a prompt and clear manner.
