Dr. Reeves is a leading presenter, researcher and author in the areas of standards, assessment, accountability and school leadership and is working with the CSDE district leaders and principals to develop and implement a standards-based model of student accountability. During his presentation, Dr. Reeves will build on his previous work with the CT Association of Schools, in which he identified the "antecedents of excellence" for improvements in student achievement and quality.

Dr. Reeves is founder and chief executive officer of the Center for Performance Assessment, an international organization dedicated to improving student achievement and educational equality. He has authored more than 20 books including the best selling <u>Make Standards Work</u>, now in its third edition. Dr. Reeves is a faculty member of leadership programs sponsored by the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

1:40 PM Connecticut State Department of Education Update

Dr. Nancy Stark, Education Manager of School Improvement and Literacy at the CT State Department of Education, has been a Teacher, a Director of Special Education and Pupil Services and a Principal serving the school districts of Glastonbury, West Hartford and Bloomfield. Dr. Stark is responsible for overseeing CT's Accountability for Learning Initiative. Dr. Stark graduated from Cornell University, has a Masters Degree from Columbia and obtained her Ph.D. at the University of Maryland.

Workshop 1: Practical Applications of Making Standards Work:

The work of Dr. Douglas Reeves helps to define how to implement standards-based programming. Dr. Dottie Hoyt, Principal of Pleasant Valley Elementary School in Groton and Mr. Eric Larson, Principal of the Burr District Elementary School in Higganum, will share how they have used the work of Dr. Reeves within their own schools. They will share how to begin the process in your school.

Workshop 2: <u>Implementing a Data-Based Accountability System:</u>

The Bristol Public Schools instituted a data-driven accountability system modeled on the work of Dr. Reeves four years ago. Dr. Michael Wasta, Superintendent, and his staff members will describe the practical issues associated with the implementation of the system including the successes and challenges. They will also describe how the system has evolved over time to focus on all major components of the system, from the Board of Education, to teachers, to transportation providers, on the single goal of improving student achievement.
