Middle Level Board Meetings

The Middle-Level Board of Control led by Tim Salem, principal of Scotts Ridge Middle School, met virtually this year for valuable discussion around topics of interest and concern to middle level members. NAESP and NASSP National Leadership Conference and Capitol Hill Day

The joint NAESP-NASSP National School Leaders Advocacy Conference was held in Washington, DC, in March 2025. Capitol Connections: A Networking Event for School Leaders and Lawmakers

The Capitol Connections event provided a unique opportunity for members to connect with legislators and fellow school leaders to discuss the pressing issues impacting K-12 education in Connecticut. It facilitated meaningful conversations between policymakers, CAS staff and principals, ensuring that the voices of those leading our schools are heard.

Professional Learning Opportunities

The Middle Level Board of Control regularly engaged in discussions about professional learning interests and needs, using the member feedback from surveys and other sources to drive decisions. Middle level board members also participated in the Center for Leadership and Innovation Planning Summit in April, which led to a strategic plan for professional development for the next year.
