Acting Superintendent of Schools, Windsor Public Schools

Dr. Noha Abdel-Hady is a passionate and dynamic educational leader dedicated to empowering students and inspiring future leaders. As Acting Superintendent of Windsor Public Schools, she leads with a vision of academic excellence, equity, and opportunity for all. With over two decades of experience in education—spanning classroom teaching, district leadership, and higher education—Dr. Abdel-Hady is known for turning big ideas into bold action. She has launched innovative initiatives such as the Windsor Mobile Classroom, which brings learning directly to neighborhoods, and the district's "4Cs" cultural framework, which unites students and staff around the values of being Courageous, Caring, Committed, and Creative. A global citizen who has lived on three continents, Dr. Abdel-Hady brings a unique perspective on leadership, resilience, and the power of staying true to one's identity. She was honored with the Phenomenal Woman Award by the Windsor Human Relations Commission for her outstanding achievement, advocacy, and commitment to excellence. Her leadership journey reflects her core belief: that every young person has the power to dream boldly, lead with purpose, and make a lasting difference in their community and beyond.

Idhaant is a civic strategist and cultural translator passionate about diplomacy, educational equity, and youth empowerment. She began her career at ESPN in the International Soccer Department, traveling to Europe to cover matches. However, driven by a desire to give back, Marissa transitioned to roles supporting families and communities. She supervised the Nurturing Families Network, empowering first-time mothers, and advocated for Universal Healthcare in Connecticut as a Community Organizer prior to the Affordable Care Act. While raising her two children, she worked with Children First Initiative and later served for the next 15 years as a Family School Liaison and College and Career Coordinator in the Meriden Public School system. Currently, she is the Senior Engagement Specialist at the Connecticut Association of Schools. Throughout her career, Marissa has been dedicated to supporting children and families facing challenges similar to those she overcame as a first-generation college graduate. Music remains a vital part of Marissa's life and a way to express her Latina heritage. She released her debut album Ayer y Hoy in 2013 and her original single "Tu Naciste Para Mi" in 2017, available on major platforms including iTunes and Spotify.

Aerospace Production Manager & Real Estate Investor

Demetrius Chamblee, a proud native of Hartford, Connecticut, is an entrepreneur, community builder, and operational leader with deep roots in both aerospace production and real estate investment. He earned his Associate's Degree in Business Administration from Manchester Community College in 2016 and is currently pursuing a bachelor's degree in Organizational Management. Above all, he is a devoted husband to Latoya and a present, purpose-driven father to Xyimea and Demetrius Jr.

In his role as a Production Manager in the Aerospace Heat Treat Industry, Demetrius is known for transforming work cultures and production systems. He has implemented effective strategies to reduce turnaround time, eliminate communication breakdowns, and foster greater alignment between production and quality. His leadership style blends discipline, empathy, and execution.

Demetrius leads as President of ASE Investments, a real estate investment group dedicated to empowering communities through property ownership. In his role as Vice President of Prolific Society Investment Group, he helps build collective wealth through the stock and crypto markets, and entrepreneurial ventures. He also gained retail business experience through his five year ownership of Madams Beauty Supply.

A passionate advocate for literacy and lifelong learning, Demetrius co-founded The Revolution of the Mind Book Club, which has grown to over 300 members. The club centers on financial education, personal growth, and cultural pride. Through his Books to CT Prisons initiative, over 400 books have been donated to incarcerated individuals, offering inspiration, knowledge, and a second chance through learning. His 20/20 campaign has supported more than 30 Black-owned businesses with visibility and community-backed investment, stretching its reach to Massachusetts and California.

Demetrius continues to lead financial education workshops that break down complex topics like the debt-to-income ratio, credit, budgeting, and investing. He is often invited to speak at schools, churches, and community events where his relatability, clarity, and humility resonate with youth and adults alike.

He is especially committed to uplifting boys and men so they can develop confidence, discipline, and purpose. Through his own example of fatherhood, financial responsibility, and a consistent message around reading and health, Demetrius is seen by many as a modern day blueprint for leading with strength and heart. His work has been recognized with multiple honors, including the Modern-Day Martin Luther King Jr. Award, the 100 Men of Color Award, and the Neighborhood Hero Key to the City of Hartford Award in 2021. Those who know him describe him as consistent, grounded, disciplined, and quietly powerful, someone who not only teaches leadership but lives it.

She is currently pursuing her doctorate at the University of Connecticut, advancing her expertise in educational leadership.

Laura began her educational career as a teacher leader in New Haven, where she taught both Kindergarten and 6th grade for 11 years. After 14 years in health and welfare insurance, Hilton transitioned into real estate, where she founded the Greater Hartford Association of Realtors Bridge Committee—Connecticut's first and longest-running DEI committee in the industry. In 2016, she co-led the successful push to reinstate mandatory in-person Fair Housing Education, earning the Connecticut Fair Housing Empowering Communities Award.

In 2020, Hilton focused on curriculum development, creating and teaching the influential course Understanding and Preventing Bias in Your Real Estate Practice to over 8,000 licensees. Her leadership extended to board service with both the Greater Hartford and Connecticut Realtor Associations, and she was named 2021 Realtor of the Year. Hilton's advocacy work includes founding The Hilton Advocacy Group, LLC in 2010, supporting K-12 students with IEPs, 504 Plans, and those facing racial or LGBTQIA+ challenges. She serves as Board Secretary for RE-Center's Race & Camp; Equity Board and is the Immediate Past President of The Waterbury (CT) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated.

In 2023, Hilton became Community Health and Well Being Manager at Saint Mary's Hospital / Trinity Health Of New England. In 2025, she was honored with the Community Legacy Leader Award by Legacy Leaders.

She lives in Southington, CT with her spouse, Howard Campbell, and is the proud mother of Jared (RPI '22) and Trent (UConn '26).



DR. DAMON LEWIS

Principal, Ponus Ridge STEAM Academy, Norwalk

Dr. Damon C. Lewis is the Principal of Ponus Ridge STEAM Academy in Norwalk, CT, where he leads efforts to close the achievement gap for students of color and create equitable learning opportunities for all. Under his leadership, Ponus Ridge saw a 23% decrease in chronic absenteeism during the 2024-2025 school year (including an all-time low of 7.7% in May 2025). Dr. Lewis also expanded opportunities for Latinx and Black students in the Gifted and Talented Program and increased female participation in Accelerated Math. Eighth-grade PSAT scores surpassed district, state, and national averages in fall 2024.

He believes that every student can achieve great things when exposed to learning aligned with their interests, and that progress—rather than perfection—drives lasting change. Together with his staff, Dr. Lewis has built an "Every Day Counts" culture focused on consistency, collaboration, and high expectations.

A 15-year veteran of Ponus Ridge and an 11-year Principal, Dr. Lewis has served in multiple educational roles across Connecticut, including teacher, coach, counselor, and administrator in Bridgeport, Trumbull, and Stratford. He is also a co-facilitator of the Norwalk Early Principal Academy, a panelist for aspiring administrators at Cooperative Educational Services (CES), and co-author of Aligning Voices: Urban Teachers and Leaders.

Dr. Lewis was named the state of Connecticut Middle School Principal of The Year by CAS in February 2025. Additionally, Dr. Lewis was named the National Middle School Principal of the Year by NASSP (National Association of Secondary School Principals) in July 2025. Dr. Lewis has appeared on several podcasts, and been interviewed by several outlets including Education Week and the National School Boards Association.

Dr. Lewis was also honored by the Norwalk NAACP with the J.P. Ball Memorial Award for Leadership and served as honorary captain for the University of Connecticut's 2025 home opening football game. A proud graduate of Harding High School, Bridgeport, CT and former UConn football captain, Dr. Lewis holds multiple degrees from UConn, the University of Bridgeport, and Southern Connecticut State University. He is an avid reader who admires the work of Jim Collins and Malcolm Gladwell.
