<u>DIRECTIONS</u> TO THE WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

From Hartford and points north: Take I-91 south to Exit 22 (which is a left exit) to Route 9. Take Exit 15 (sign will say Wesleyan University). You are now on Washington Street. At the fourth light take a left onto High Street. The Exley Science Center is on Church Street, which is the second right after turning onto High Street.

From New Haven and points south: Take I-95 to I-91 north to Exit 18. Or take the Merritt/Wilbur Cross Parkway (Route 15) to Route 66 east. This becomes Washington Street. Take a right onto High Street after the Memorial Green. There is a Wesleyan University sign at the corner of Washington and High Streets. The Exley Science Center is on Church Street, which is the second right after turning onto High Street.
