Westfield Corporation Bruce Eagleson Memorial Scholarship Awards Totaling \$20,000.00

<u>THE AWARD</u>: There will be \$20,000 in awards presented annually to three recipients in honor of Bruce Eagleson, Westfield Corporation's former East Coast Vice-President of Management. Bruce was one of the originators of the CAS Arts Awards Banquet. He died on September 11, 2001 while working for Westfield at the World Trade Center. ELIGIBILITY: Any senior may apply for Bruce Eagleson Memorial Scholarship award. The recipient of this award does not have to be an honoree at the CAS awards banquet; however, the recipient must be a senior graduating from a CAS member high school and must be entering into higher education program leading to a degree in either the visual or performing arts.

CRITERIA:

- The candidate should be highly accomplished in at least one branch of the arts, including, but not limited to, visual, music, theater, dance, design, architecture, and the like.
- The candidate should have considerable experience in one of the arts as evidenced by involvement in shows, exhibits, performances, video productions, or the like.
- The candidate should be involved in service to his/her peers and/or community through artistic or other activities.
- The candidate should have financial need.

APPLICATION:

- 1. Two (2) letters of recommendation, one of which must be from the student's teacher in his/her arts specialty attesting to the level of his/her artistic accomplishment. A second letter from a school professional attesting to the student's strong character and service contribution.
- 2. A letter or other reliable evidence of acceptance into a higher education program leading to a degree in either the visual, performing or related arts. (A letter on school letterhead stating that you have applied to a school if acceptance has yet to be obtained.)
- 3. A statement of 250 words from the applicant on the following topic: "What led you to your decision to pursue a career in the arts." Appropriate writing style is expected.
- 4. Physical evidence demonstrating the candidate's artistic accomplishment. A 3 min. tape or video for the performing arts and six, 4" X 6" photographs (no slides please) for visual arts.
- 5. A brief financial need statement and expected college costs.
