- 2021 National Leaders Conference -- The decision was made to hold the conference remotely, stating "After extensive deliberation, NAESP's Board of Directors has made the difficult decision to implement a modified virtual format for the upcoming National Leaders Conference (NLC), February 21-24, 2021. NAESP's Board determined that moving forward with the in-person conference ran the risk of exposing attendees to the communicable disease, which would only be exacerbated if an attendee returned to his/her school community and passed it on to staff and students. Ultimately, the Board concluded that the only responsible move was to eliminate all potential risk to attendees."
