Dear Alliance District Administrator,

In the spring of 2011, we asked CAS to develop a year-long leadership training program for school leaders - principals and assistant principals - in the 18 partner districts. We asked that it be rigorous, high level training with month-to-month differentiated assignments and opportunities for hands-on experiences. We further asked that there be a great deal of dialogue between and among the participants, presenters, and the CSDE and CAS staff members. CAS did just that organizing and implementing a highly successful **Principals' Leadership Series**.

With CAS, we have further refined the eight day training series and will repeat it for school leaders in the 30 Alliance Districts. The foundation for the series remains the McREL research document, *Simply Better - Doing What Matters Most To Change The Odds For Student Success*, along with the practical application strategies captured in *Teach Like a Champion* by Doug Lemov. The format has been designed such that there will be a presenter for the morning session each day covering the key elements discussed in the McREL document with facilitated discussions in the afternoon about the application of the morning lessons to each participant's school. Relating the presentations and discussions to the current research on school and district improvement and highlighting the alignment to their current Alliance District improvement plans will be critical.

CAS Executive Coaches will serve as facilitators for each of the cohorts of 12 to 14 principals/assistant principals with the CAS coach remaining with the same cohort throughout the training sessions. To the extent possible, CAS coaches and principals/assistant principals will be grouped by school level (ES, MS, HS). It is expected that there will be 60 school leaders participating.
