Dr. Liu-Constant will present research findings from the Pedagogy of Play project focusing on leadership practices that foster a schoolwide culture of playful learning.

Also, a panel of three CT administrators will share insights, experiences and success stories about implementing play-based learning in their respective schools/districts. Through firsthand accounts, they will explore the ways in which play-oriented educational approaches address content standards and build executive function and 21st century skills.
