

PLAY-BASED LEARNING:

Meeting Standards Through Purposeful Play While Supporting Executive Function Skills

Research shows that young children learn best through play. When children play, they are using many executive function components that are important learning and life skills – problem solving, self-regulation, cooperation, cognitive flexibility, negotiation, and creativity.
