1. WELCOME - Dave Tanner welcomed everyone.
2. MINUTES - The committee approved the minutes from May 3, 2022
3. FINANCIAL REPORT - Mr. Simon gave a brief financial report and distributed the comparison year over year.. Schools still have not paid their tournament fees. The CIAC is sending reminders to schools to pay their fees. The crowds were a little better than last year. Sites for various expenses are different based on the site. Weather hurt the income for the boys tournament this year.
4. REVIEW OF SOCCER TOURNAMENT - Mark Berkowitz recognized the work of Lilly, Dave, and Joe on the championships. He reported that semifinals are getting harder to place. Schools are getting less interested in hosting neutral site games. Reporting scores is an issue.

Success in Tournament

Success in Tournament Schools 2021, 2022

East Catholic 2021 Did not make tournament, 2022 State Champion
Notre Dame Fairfield 2021 Lost in semi-final, 2022 lost in championship game

Current Language

1. The Boys and Girls Soccer Committee voted to apply a success in tournament factor when placing schools* that draw students from outside their school district boundaries in tournament divisions. The Committee will first place schools in their divisions by enrollment and then use success in tournament to move schools up in division and then rebalance the divisions. Schools that draw from outside their school district boundaries who have been in the semi-finals or above two of the last three years will move up one division. Schools that have been in the semi-finals three of the last three years will move up two divisions. The most any school could move would be two divisions. Each year the committee will review results from the past three years and make adjustments as appropriate. Schools can move up or down depending on their success in tournament play.

*Charter, magnet, parochial, vocational technical, vocational agricultural and Project Choice schools that have more than 25 each of male/female students from out-of-district.

Current Girls Basketball Language

1. The “success in tournament” factor will then be applied to all schools of choice . **The CIAC Girls Basketball Committee has redesigned the “success in tournament” for this year’s tournament.** Schools of choice will be given points for success in each round of the tournament from the previous three years beginning with the quarter-finals.

- A team reaching the quarter-finals receives 1 point.
- A team reaching the semi-finals receives 2.5 points.
- A team reaching the championship game receives 4.5 points
- A team winning a state championship receives 7 points.

These points will be added together and applied to the scale below for division movement.

2.5 points – 4.5 points – one division

5 points – 8 points – two divisions
