GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS AWARD PROGRAM

Purpose

Under the direction of Connecticut Commissioner of Education, Dr. Betty Sternberg, the Connecticut Association of Schools (CAS) and Big Y World Class Market have again collaborated to create the Governor's Scholars Program. The purpose of the program is to recognize and to honor academically talented high school students in schools throughout the state, and to present thirty students for special recognition to the Governor of Connecticut.

Eligibility

All high school principals associated with the Connecticut Association of Schools have the opportunity to nominate one student to the Governor's Scholars Committee. The student selected must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a legal resident of Connecticut
- 2. Be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident alien
- 3. Be a high school junior
- 4. Rank in the top 4 percent of his/her class
- 5. Submit a completed application and essay, postmarked by February 10, 2005, to:

Selection

Members of the Governor's Scholars Committee, professional educators from throughout Connecticut, will judge all completed applications and assign a composite score to each based on the following: Rank in Class - 20%; PSAT or SAT scores - 20%; CAPT scores - 20%; Student Essay - 40%. For private schools that do not administer CAPT, the composite score assigned to each applicant will be based on the following: Rank in Class - 30%; PSAT or SAT scores - 30%; Student Essay - 40%. The thirty applicants with the highest composite scores as represented across ERGs will be recognized as Governor's Scholars.

Notification and Awards

The distinguished nominees will be recognized at their schools for their outstanding work and participation in this program. Finalists will receive notification of their selection through the Connecticut Association of Schools with an invitation to the Governor's Luncheon. Governor's Scholars will receive recognition and information on participation in courses and research projects at selected Connecticut colleges and universities.
