Current Language

6.0 Eligibility

6.9 CHANGING TEAMS

An athlete may change sports up to the date of the first scheduled varsity contest in the sport he/she wishes to leave. However, an athlete may NOT change teams or sports after the first scheduled varsity contest in the sport he/she is leaving, even if athletic eligibility has not been declared.

Suggested Language

6.0 Eligibility

6.9 CHANGING TEAMS

An athlete may change sports up to the date of the first scheduled varsity contest in the sport he/she wishes to leave. However, an athlete may NOT change teams or sports *once that student has participated in a contest at any level or seven days* after the first scheduled varsity contest in the sport he/she is leaving.

Dear CIAC Board of Control,

It was brought to my attention that the Old Saybrook Boys' Soccer Program had a player on the 2022 roster who had transferred in and was not reported correctly to the CIAC. Peter Pond is a current junior and lifelong Old Saybrook resident. He attended elementary school and middle school in Old Saybrook. Peter then attended Xavier High School where he was a member of the junior varsity soccer team during his freshman and sophomore years, while still living in Old Saybrook. Peter then transferred to Old Saybrook High School over the summer between his sophomore and junior years.

Before taking the job as Athletic Director in 2020, Brendan Saunders was a teacher in Old Saybrook for sixteen years at both the middle school and elementary school, having Peter in classes on multiple occasions. Seeing his name on a roster brought up no red flags for Mr. Saunders, having only known him as an Old Saybrook student. This oversight was unintentional.

Peter was a member of the Old Saybrook High School soccer team for ten games this past season, participating in six. He did not have a goal or an assist in any competition and never participated in the first half. He left the team for personal reasons before tournament play began.

- Checking CIAC rosters from schools in which student transferred
